GENERAL EDUCATION CORE CURRICULUM

AREA I: MATHEMATICS AND NATURAL SCIENCES

- 1) 2 semesters of Mathematics. At least one semester must include a course containing some calculus (MA 19, 121, 125, or 171.) A sophomore or upper-division course may be used with the approval of the department.
 - 2) 2 semesters of a natural science. Any two courses in any of the natural sciences, as well as PY 261, fulfill this requirement.
- NOTE: Psychology majors cannot use PY 261 to fulfill this core science requirement.

AREA II: HISTORY AND THE SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES

- 1) 2 semesters of History. HI 30 plus one 200 level course. Also available as an option in this area is CL 115-116 (Greek and Roman Civilization).
- 2) 2 semesters of Anthropology, Communication (CO 100 and CO 130 only), Economics, Politics, Psychology, or Sociology. Both courses may be in the same department or they may be in two different departments. Also includes ED 241 for Education Minors only.

AREA III: PHILOSOPHY, RELIGIOUS STUDIES, AND APPLIED ETHICS

- 1) 2 semesters of Philosophy. PH 10 is required followed by a 100-level course
- 2) 2 semesters of Religious Studies. RS 10 is required.
- 3) 1 additional course in Philosophy (200 level), Religious Studies, or Applied Ethics. Also includes ED 329 for Education Minors only and PJ 120.

AREA IV: ENGLISH AND Visual and Performing Arts

- 1) 3 semesters of English. EN 11-12 are required. The third course may be selected from any of the English literature offerings which have a number designation EN 100-199. Writing Courses (EN/W) do not fulfill the core literature requirement. Also available as options in this area are courses offering literature in translation. (See Listings under Classical Studies as well as Modern Languages and Literatures).
- 2) 2 semesters of Visual and Performing Arts. One semester must be in the area of Art History, Music History, Theatre History, or Film, Television & Media Arts. The second semester may be selected from any of the 3 credit offerings in Art History, Music, Film, Television & Media Arts.

AREA V: MODERN AND CLASSICAL LANGUAGES

- 1) 2 semesters (at the intermediate level) of any language listed among the offerings of the Modern Languages and Literatures Department or the Classical Studies Program.

The service activities for the course are similar to the readings, lectures, class discussions and other assignments – all are contexts for student learning. Courses will appear with the following notation in the right-hand column of the schedule of classes: SerL or SerL Option.

SerL Option = students have a choice to participate in service learning as a final project and/or in lieu of another comparable project.

STUDENTS: Unsure of whom your Faculty Advisor is?

Students can look up the name of their Faculty Advisor through my.fairfield.edu. Click on the Student Tab, and then click “My Academics,” click “Advising” under Quick Links (let side of screen). Then click “Advisor Name.” Select the current term (for example, 2013 is Spring 2013), and click “Submit.”

UNDERGRADUATE REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Students with a financial or Dean of Students hold will not be able to register.
- Students need to see their faculty advisor prior to registration to discuss course selection and to receive their PIN.
- **Students are NOT excused from class to register. This includes cutting class or leaving class early.**
- On-line registration will be by class year: one day for all students in each class to register for his/her courses. Classes will go on-line in alphabetical groupings every 45 minutes starting at 8:30 a.m. on their designated day. Spring Varsity Athletes will precede the alphabetical groupings.
- Students will register for major, minor, core and elective courses on their class registration day and are limited to a maximum of 20 credits.
- The on-line registration system will be active for each class until 11:59 p.m. Then the student's on-line registration and PIN will be turned off until Tuesday, April 30th when add/drop begins.
- There will be a day in between each class registration for departments to review registrations and for students who missed their registration to register in person in the Registrar's Office.
- The University reserves the right to cancel courses for which there are insufficient registration or change time codes or professors as deemed necessary.
- Most courses will be open during the on-line registration period. Some departments (with courses that have specific populations) may incrementally increase the maximum number of spaces in some of their courses by class.

Waitlist Courses

The waitlist for courses will be turned on at the beginning of on-line registration, except for courses with maximums that are increased incrementally.

- When a space opens up in a class, the first student on the waitlist will be notified via his/her Fairfield student e-mail account, with instructions on how to register for the waitlisted class. **They will have 24 hours from the time the email is sent to register for the class.** If there is a conflict in his/her schedule, they will have to resolve that issue before registering for the waitlisted class. If they fail to register for the class by the deadline stated in the email, they will be taken off of the waitlist for that class.
- The use of the wait lists and the process of notifying students will run from Monday May 6th through Friday, August 30th. During this period, the Registrar's office will not honor write-ins for closed courses from faculty. The electronic waitlist will be the only mechanism for filling available openings in courses. After September 1st, students can register for classes with open seats on a first come, first serve basis. During the Add/Drop period of September 3-9, the Registrar will accept write-ins from faculty for closed courses.

Degree Evaluation on the Web!!!

All matriculated undergraduate students have a degree evaluation online, showing the requirement of his/her program, including core, majors, and minors. To run a degree evaluation on **my.fairfield.edu**:

- 1) Click "Student Tab" > Click "My Academics"
- 2) Click "Advising" under Quick Links (left side of page)
- 3) Click on "Degree Evaluation" and select current term
- 4) Click on "Generate a New Evaluation"
- 5) Select Program
- 6) Select Generate Request
- 7) Select detailed requirements and then click "Submit."

Directions for Student Self-Service Registration System

Student Self-Service accounts are accessed through my.fairfield.edu. Every student has an account on this system. If a student needs assistance with his/her NetID or password, they should contact the Help Desk at (203) 254-4069 or ext. 4069 on campus. After logging in to **my.fairfield.edu**:

- 1) Click "Student" tab, Select Registration
- 2) Click "Add or Drop Classes" in the Quick Links area (left side of screen)
- 3) If prompted, go through the steps for Electronic Promissory Agreement
- 4) From the Term Code drop-down menu in the Promissory Agreement Term choose the term for which you are registering, click "Submit"
- 5) The Electronic Promissory Agreement may appear. If so, read and understand the agreement and click "I Agree" if you agree to the terms

- 6) Beneath, click the words “Registration Form” to display the Registration Term screen
- 7) From the dropdown menu “Select A Term” choose the term for which you are registering, click “Submit”
- 8) In the Alternate Pin field, enter the PIN provided by your advisor, click “Submit”

To Add a Class

If you already know the CRN

- 1) Click on “Add/Drop Classes” (in the Quick Links on the left side of screen)
- 2) Scroll down to Add Classes Worksheet
- 3) Enter CRN, or multiple CRNs one per field, of the 10 blank fields available
- 4) Click “Submit Changes” button beneath
- 5) The page will refresh and display the status of each class in the Current Schedule area

Note: If there is a problem with the registration a section titled **Registration Add Errors** will appear below and explain the error.

If you do not know the CRN

Basic Search – Default view

- 1) Click “Search for a Class” in Quick Links area or Class Search button at the bottom of the page
- 2) From the dropdown menu “Select A Term” choose the term to search, click “Submit”
- 3) In “Look Up Classes” – Click to select the desired Subject from the alphabetical scrolling list
- 4) Click “Course Search”
- 5) Courses in that subject area are listed, with View Sections buttons to the right
- 6) Click the “View Sections” button for a course to view the availability

Advanced Search – used when looking for all courses related to a specific subject area required by a course, or a specific subject, time slot, etc.

- 1) Click “Search for a Class” in Quick Links area or Class Search button at the bottom of the page
- 2) From the dropdown menu “Select A Term” choose the term to search, click “Submit”
- 3) Without choosing a subject, scroll down to the bottom of the page and click “Advanced Search” to display numerous criteria to search.
- 4) The more criteria that are chosen, the narrower the list of results.

Viewing the Search Results. The search results are displayed with column headings.

- **Select:** Square indicates an available course/section, (C) indicates closed section
- **CRN:** Identifies the CRN (Course Reference Number) if you should need to note it
- **Subj:** Subject area
- **Crse:** Course number
- **Sec:** Section identifier
- **Days:** Days of the week are each first initial = (M, T, W, F), Thursday = (R), Saturday = (S)
- **Time:** Time the course meets
- **Cap:** Seat capacity
- **WL Cap or WL Rem:** Waitlist Capacity or Waitlist Remaining seats
- **Instructor:** Instructor’s name, if assigned
- **Location:** Building and Room, if assigned

Selecting the Class

- 1) Click the Check Box of the desired class in the Select column
- 2) Scroll to the bottom of the page and click the **Register** button in the lower left corner. You will be returned to the Add/Drop Classes page.
- 3) The status of the class is listed the Current Schedule area

Note: If there is a problem with the registration a section titled **Registration Add Errors** will appear below and explain the error.

Dropping a class

- 1) If a course needs to be Dropped, click “Add/Drop Classes” from the Quick Links
- 2) Scroll down to Current Schedule
- 3) In the Action column select Drop/Web for course to be dropped
- 4) Scroll to the bottom of the page and click “Submit Changes.” You will be returned to the Add/Drop Classes page.

Waitlist

To place a class on Waitlist

- 1) Search for the class. Once displayed, determine by viewing the **WL Rem** (Waitlist Remaining) column where a number greater than “0” indicates a waitlist is available.
- 2) Write down the CRN number
- 3) Scroll to the bottom of the page. Click “Register.” You will be returned to the Add/Drop Classes page.
- 4) Scroll down to the Add Classes worksheet
- 5) Type in the CRN you wrote in to one of the 10 blank fields
- 6) Click “Submit Changes”
- 7) A registration Add Errors section will appear
- 8) Select Waitlist under the Action column
- 9) Click “Submit Changes”

Remember to add labs when necessary. If a student does not have a computer with Internet capabilities, they can use one in the computer labs, the library, or the Dolan School of Business. If a student needs assistance with registration, they should contact the Registrar’s Office at 254-4288 or (or just 4288 on campus). **They SHOULD NOT call the Help Desk.**

Remember, any student with a Financial or Dean of Student’s “HOLD” will not be allowed to register.

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NEW COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

AY 199/PH 265 – Philosophy and Economy Anthropology

This course examines “the economy” from philosophical and anthropological perspectives. We will investigate why people produce and exchange things, why they seek to amass things in some circumstances and give them away in others, and how our modern understandings of value, debt, and rationality emerged. (Prerequisite: PH 101) Three credits.

BI 383D – Special Topics: Evolution or BI 383D Special Topics: Evolutionary Biology

The broad objective of this course is to encourage students to integrate all the knowledge they have acquired as a biology major to critically interpret and analyze questions from an evolutionary perspective. We will read and discuss the current literature on major evolutionary topics, which have revolutionized the way in which we think about genomics, sex and reproduction, and our own human beginnings. We will also address important but controversial topics such as evolutionary medicine and evolutionary psychology. The course centers on student led discussions, presentations and literature critiques. Pre-requisites: BI 170, 171, and 172, CH 211-212 and one additional upper-level course in the Ecology and Evolution Block. (Prerequisites: BI 170, 171, and 172, one course from the Ecology Block and senior status or permission of the instructor). Three credits.

CL 325/HI 325 – Athenian Democracy and Empire

This history seminar provides an in-depth exploration of classical Athens at the height of its power in the fifth century BC. Its focus is on close reading of the primary sources describing the rise and fall of Athens in this period. It places particular emphasis on the parallel rise of Athenian democracy at home and the Athenian empire overseas. It places secondary emphasis on the nature of Athenian intellectual discourse in this period. A final research project will engage modern scholarly debates on the nature of fifth-century Athens. (Prerequisite: HI 200-level or permission of instructor) Three credits.

CO 329 – Contemporary Topics in Organizational Communication: Conflict

Conflict is a natural part of human life that has a variety of potential consequences. Although conflict can be disruptive and destructive, it can also be constructive and lead to improved adjustment and better decisions. The course is designed to offer you opportunities to enhance and improve your techniques and skills in managing conflict and moving them in a productive direction. The course examines the dynamics of human conflict across a variety of settings from personal relationships to the workplace, with special attention to the communication processes that escalate, manage, and mediate conflict. No prerequisites.

CO 338 – Media Audiences

Media Audiences has three related aims: (1) to introduce the theoretical and academic study of media audiences (2) to introduce students to qualitative field research methods and (3) to prepare students to engage with the current media industry through an examination of applied audience research. Recognizing that the study of media audiences is an important theoretical as well as practical endeavor, we will consider how audiences have been studied historically, in the academy, and within media industries. (Prerequisite: CO 130) Three credits.

EG 50 – Engineering Seminar

This course presents a broad range of interests, industries, and professions to engineering students. The engineering seminar course prepares students for upper level classes, professional employment and graduate school. Topics to include resume preparation, interviewing techniques, hands-on laboratories, lifelong learning, plant tours, etc. The course also provides an insight into the current and cutting-edge activities in engineering presented by in-house and outside speakers. All engineering students to enroll in this course and be available to attend. No credit. No prerequisites.

EN 130 – Literature by Women: Vision and Revision

This study of transatlantic, post-1800 literature by women will adopt Virginia Woolf's notion that “books continue each other.” The course will be anchored in such “touchstone” texts as Jane Austen's *Pride and Prejudice*, Charlotte Brontë's *Jane Eyre*, and Edith Wharton's *The House of Mirth*. Each touchstone work will be grouped with a number of subsequent literary texts responding to and/or revising the earlier work. Readings will reach across centuries and continents. Topics include the social constructions of race, sexuality, gender, class, and beauty, intertextuality, influence, and canon formation. (Prerequisites: EN 11 and 12) Three credits. (B)

EN 210 – Special Topics: Roots of English Poetry

This course surveys the major poets and styles of English lyric poetry from the fourteenth to the eighteenth centuries, with special attention to sixteenth-century sonnets, seventeenth-century metaphysical poetry, and eighteenth-century satire. The course is designed to give students a sense of the development of the English language and its literary forms, to consider literary texts in their cultural and historical contexts, and to foster skills in close reading and careful literary analysis. Prerequisite: 100-level English literature class or the equivalent, or permission of instructor. Three credits.

EN 230A – Nineteenth-Century American Literature and Culture

This course surveys African American, Native American, and European American writers before the Civil War to the end of the century. Students analyze the ways literature influenced and was shaped by key movements, such as slavery and abolitionism, suffrage and Indian removal, labor and immigration, and spiritual life and science. The course explores issues of canonicity and cultural studies, drawing examples from film and popular culture to understand how we have defined ourselves as a nation. Writers include Poe, Emerson, Thoreau, Melville, Hawthorne, Douglass, Jacobs, Stowe, Dickinson, Whitman, Zitkala-Sa, Davis, Twain, Chopin, and Gilman. Prerequisite: EN 100-level course or equivalent. Three credits.

ENW 329B – Issues NW: Storytelling with Visualized Information

This semester, Issue in News Writing focuses on how to use interactive and visual representation of abstract data to tell news stories. Students will learn about approaches to access public data and use user-friendly tools to turn them into interesting visuals by applying various principles of information visualization. The course also teaches the basics of data analysis and state-of-the-art web technologies that enable readers to interact with data in compelling ways. (Prerequisite: ENW 220) Three credits.

FTM 107 – Television Genres

Basic to understanding television as an art form is the concept of genre. This course introduces students to the defining characteristics and the critical analysis of television genre. On a rotating basis, the course focuses on drama, serial, situation comedy, news and documentary, and reality television, examining distinct conception, writing, production, directing, editing and other conventions of each. Social and historical elements of the genre are also addressed. This course may be taken twice, is an elective history/analysis course for majors and minors in the FTM program, and fulfills a history VPA core requirement. Three credits.

FTM 109 – Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity, and the Movies

This course examines how American movies have portrayed gender and queer sexuality—lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender/transsexual, and questioning—to create a range of stereotypical and multi-dimensional characters. From “coded” sexual references in classical films, to timid New Hollywood-era films, to today’s thriving independent cinema, this representational genealogy includes condescending myth and bold truth-telling, works that both mirror and shape their cultural moment. This course satisfies an elective for majors and a history/analysis requirement for minors in the Film, Television & Media Arts Program, and a history requirement for VPA core. Three credits.

FTM 132 – Web Design

In this course students will understand and analyze current digital culture in order to develop the fundamental concepts and skills essential to designing professional websites. Students learn the theory of digital design, explore how information architecture and graphic design theories apply to the web medium, and understand how to use appropriate software to integrate audio, video, and animation into the web medium. Students will create a website that addresses a current social or environmental issue. This course satisfies an elective for FTM majors, a production requirement for FTM minors, and applied VPA core. (Prerequisite: FTM 10) Three credits.

HI313 – Godless: Atheism and Skeptical Thought in the West

The history of atheism—or whether atheism even has a history—is difficult to establish. Scholars have used a narrow definition of the term atheism to suggest its origins in the 18th century, or a broad definition to trace its antecedents back to classical antiquity. This course considers atheism within the tradition of skepticism, and leaves open for classroom debate the question of whether the thinkers studied—from Epicurus to Ingersoll, Diderot to Dawkins—represent a coherent tradition or merely a collection of radical challenges, each tied to its own time and place. (Prerequisite: HI10) Three credits.

IS 310 – E-Business Applications

This course examines e-business applications such as knowledge management, enterprise resource planning (ERP), customer relationship management (CRM), and mobile applications in inter-organizational, national, and global business environments. Students explore new e-business applications, the economics of e-business, value chains and value networks, related legal and ethical issues, information privacy and security, disaster planning and recovery, and the impact of emerging e-business and mobile applications. The course includes a brief introduction to technical architecture, technology solutions, and financing required for effective e-business applications. Students investigate emerging opportunities, challenges, and trends through interactive team exercises, case studies, and individual research projects and presentations. (Prerequisite: IS 100) Three credits.

MA 120 – Applied Calculus II

Topics in this course include: applications of the derivative, including implicit differentiation, related rates and linear approximation; integration of algebraic, transcendental and trigonometric functions; differentiation of trigonometric functions; techniques of integration; applications of the definite integral; infinite series. A graphing calculator and Wolfram Alpha are among the technologies that may be used. MA 120 is not a prerequisite for MA 171. Students who receive credit for any one of MA 120, MA 146 or MA 172 may not receive credit for either of the other two. (Prerequisite: MA 119 or equivalent) Three credits.

ME 355 – Biomechanics

This course introduces the fundamentals of biomechanics in a simplified manner to address students from a wide variety of disciplines. In this course, the mechanics of the human musculoskeletal system will be studied through the application of engineering methods. The course is intended to provide background in biomechanics for students interested in the biomedical and robotics field. The course covers biomechanics of bipedal gait, and the energetics of walking (e.g. how humans maintain efficiency by exchanging kinetic and potential energy during gait), passive dynamic walkers with biomimetic designs to achieve energy efficiency), and bipedal robots demonstrating where modern technology is heading. (Prerequisite: ME 201 or equivalent) Three credits.

PO 190 Special Topics: Border Politics

This course examines contemporary debates on border politics through theories of state formation, identity politics, intersectionality, postcolonialism, political geography, and poststructuralism. Students investigate the social construction of borders along with state strategies of maintaining, policing, securitizing, and militarizing the border against the “licit” and “illicit” global movement of people and goods. The course covers border politics historically and in light of challenges such as globalization and state sovereignty, immigration, the “war on terror,” and natural resources and environmental sustainability. Students will draw from these theories and contexts to explore case studies of border politics in the global north and south. (Prerequisite: six hours of politics credits or permission of instructor) Three credits.

RS 240 – The Medieval Church

This course surveys the development of Christianity in medieval Western Europe through the lens of the Western/Latin Church. It presents a broad history of the social, political and religious aspects of the Church as found in a variety of primary sources: mystical and theological writings, hagiographical literature and rules for monastic communities, and official Church documents. Through these sources students are introduced to the critical analysis of primary texts (dating from c. 300-1500) by giving proper attention to the social and cultural context in which they were written. Topics discussed in this course include: monasticism, the rise of papal power, the First Crusade, and the development of cathedrals and universities. (Prerequisite: RS 10 or RS 101) Three credits.

RS 276 – Islamic Theology

This course is a survey of major tenets of Muslim belief, points of difference, and schools of theological thought. We will explore important points of faith and investigate the debates that have emerged over the course of Islamic history. Special attention will be paid to the areas of doctrinal formulation, scholastic theology and mystical thought. Our primary readings will consist of both primary sources in translation and current secondary literature. (Prerequisite: RS 10 or RS 101) Three credits.

SW 382C – Special Topics: Android Mobile Application

This course teaches students how to build mobile apps on Android platform using Eclipse and the Android SDK. It explores the principles and challenges in designing and developing applications for the mobile devices through the coverage of the underlying theory coupled with hands-on exercise. Key concepts will be introduced from user interface design and limitations, threading and background processing, storage and data persistence, connectivity and networking, multimedia handling, and the new trends in the mobile technology. Additional topics include application deployment and availability on the app store and market, application security, efficient power management, and mobile device security. (Pre-requisite: SW 131 or permission of the instructor) Three credits.
