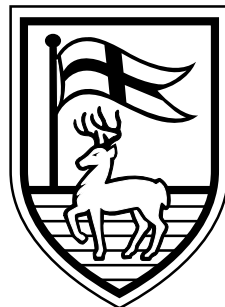

GENERAL EDUCATION CORE CURRICULUM

AREA I: MATHEMATICS AND NATURAL SCIENCES

- 1) 2 semesters of Mathematics. At least one semester must include a course containing some calculus (MA 19, 121, 125, or 171.) A sophomore or upper-division course may be used with the approval of the department.
- 2) 2 semesters of a natural science. Any two courses in any of the natural sciences, as well as PY 261, fulfill this requirement. NOTE: Psychology majors cannot use PY 261 to fulfill this core science requirement. Also EV 150 counts as science core.

AREA II: HISTORY AND THE SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES

- 1) 2 semesters of History. HI 30 plus one 200 level course. Also available as an option in this area is CL 115-116 (Greek and Roman Civilization).
- 2) 2 semesters of Anthropology, Communication (CO 100 and CO 130 only), Economics, Politics, Psychology, or Sociology. Both courses may be in the same department or they may be in two different departments. Also includes ED 241 for Education Minors only.

AREA III: PHILOSOPHY, RELIGIOUS STUDIES, AND APPLIED ETHICS

- 1) 2 semesters of Philosophy. PH 10 is required followed by a 100-level course
- 2) 2 semesters of Religious Studies. RS 10 is required.
- 3) 1 additional course in Philosophy (200 level), Religious Studies, or Applied Ethics. Also includes ED 329 for Education Minors only and PJ 120.

AREA IV: ENGLISH AND Visual and Performing Arts

- 1) 3 semesters of English. EN 11-12 are required. The third course may be selected from any of the English literature offerings which have a number designation EN 100-199. Writing Courses (EN/W) do not fulfill the core literature requirement. Also available as options in this area are courses offering literature in translation. (See Listings under Classical Studies as well as Modern Languages and Literatures).
- 2) 2 semesters of Visual and Performing Arts. One semester must be in the area of Art History, Music History, Theatre History, or New Media, Film, Radio and Television History. The second semester may be selected from any of the 3 credit offerings in Art History, Music, New Media Film, Radio, Studio Art and Theatre.

AREA V: MODERN AND CLASSICAL LANGUAGES

- 1) 2 semesters (at the intermediate level) of any language listed among the offerings of the Modern Languages and Literatures Department or the Classical Studies Program.

SERVICE LEARNING

Service Learning is a kind of experiential education that connects classroom learning with community service. In collaboration with community organizations, students learn about and apply tools of the academic discipline and specific course concepts in their service experiences. This combination enhances academic learning and civic awareness while also providing a meaningful service to and with the community. Course credit and grading are for the learning not for the service. The service activities for the course are similar to the readings, lectures, class discussions and other assignments—all are contexts for student learning. Courses will appear with the following notation in the right-hand column of the schedule of classes: SerL or SerL Option

SerL = all students in the course are required to participate in service learning

SerL Option = students have a choice to participate in service learning as a final project and/or in lieu of another comparable project.

STUDENTS: Unsure of whom your Faculty Advisor is?

Students can look up the name of their Faculty Advisor through my.fairfield.edu. Click on the Student Tab, and then click My Academics. Click Advising under Quick Links (left side of screen). Then click Advisor Name. Select the current term (for example, 2013 is Spring 2013), and click submit.

UNDERGRADUATE REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Students with a financial or Dean of Students hold will not be able to register.
- Students need to see their faculty advisor prior to registration to discuss course selection and to receive their PIN.
- **Students are NOT excused from class to register. This includes cutting class or leaving class early.**
- On-line registration will be by class year: one day for all students in each class to register for his/her courses. Classes will go on-line in alphabetical groupings every 45 minutes starting at 8:30 a.m. on their designated day. SpringVarsity Athletes will precede the alphabetical groupings.
- Students will register for major, minor, core and elective courses on their class registration day and are limited to a maximum of 20 credits.
- The on-line registration system will be active for each class until 11:59pm. Then the student's on-line registration and PIN will be turned off until Tuesday, November 20rd when add/drop begins.
- There will be a day in between each class registration for departments to review registrations and for students who missed their registration to register in person in the Registrar's Office.
- The University reserves the right to cancel courses for which there are insufficient registration or change time codes or professors as deemed necessary.
- Most courses will be open during the on-line registration period. Some departments (with courses that have specific populations) may incrementally increase the maximum number of spaces in some of their courses by class.

Waitlist Courses

The waitlist for courses will be turned on at the beginning of on-line registration, except for courses with maximums that are increased incrementally.

- When a space opens up in a class, the first student on the waitlist will be notified via his/her Fairfield student e-mail account, with instructions on how to register for the waitlisted class. **They will have 24 hours from the time the email is sent to register for the class.** If there is a conflict in his/her schedule, they will have to resolve that issue before registering for the waitlisted class. If they fail to register for the class by the deadline stated in the email, they will be taken off of the waitlist for that class.
- The use of the wait lists and the process of notifying students will run from November 26 through Friday, January 18th. During this period, the Registrar's office will not honor write-ins for closed courses from faculty. The electronic waitlist will be the only mechanism for filling available openings in courses. After January 18th, students can register for classes with open seats on a first come, first serve basis. During the Add/Drop period of January 22-28, the Registrar will accept write-ins for closed courses by faculty.

Rollover Courses

Rollover courses are full-year courses that continue from the Fall semester to the Spring semester typically with the same professor and the same time code from the Fall semester. Automatic rollovers preregisters everyone in a certain class. If a student wishes to change his/her rollover course, they may change it during his/her registration period on a space available basis.

Note: If a student has a financial or Dean of Student's hold at the time rollovers are processed, they will not be rolled over into the next class in the sequence.

Degree Evaluation on the Web!!!

All matriculated undergraduate students have a degree evaluation online, showing the requirement of his/her program, including core, majors, and minors. To run a degree evaluation on **my.fairfield.edu**:

- 1) Click Student Tab > Click My Academics
- 2) Click Advising under Quick Links (left side of page)
- 3) Click on Degree Evaluation and select current term
- 4) Click on Generate a new evaluation

- 5) Select Program
- 6) Select Generate Request
- 7) Select detailed requirements and then click "submit."

Directions for Student Self-Service Registration System

Student Self-Service accounts are accessed through **my.fairfield.edu**. Every student has an account on this system. If a student needs assistance with his/her NetID or password, they should contact the Help Desk at (203) 254-4069 or ext. 4069 on campus. After logging in to **my.fairfield.edu**:

- 1) Click Student tab, Select Registration
- 2) Click Add or Drop Classes in the Quick Links area (left side of screen).
- 3) If prompted, go through the steps for Electronic Promissory Agreement
- 4) From the Term Code drop-down menu in the Promissory Agreement Term choose the term for which you are registering, Click Submit
- 5) The Electronic Promissory Agreement may appear. If so, read and understand the agreement and Click "I Agree" if you agree to the terms
- 6) Beneath, click the words "Registration Form" to display the Registration Term screen
- 7) From the dropdown menu "Select A Term" choose the term for which you are registering, Click Submit
- 8) In the Alternate Pin field, enter the PIN provided by your advisor, Click Submit

To Add a Class

If you already know the CRN

- 1) Click on Add/Drop Classes (in the Quick Links on the left side of screen)
- 2) Scroll down to Add Classes Worksheet
- 3) Enter CRN, or multiple CRNs one per field, of the 10 blank fields available
- 4) Click Submit Changes button beneath
- 5) The page will refresh and display the status of each class in the Current Schedule area

Note: If there is a problem with the registration a section titled **Registration Add Errors** will appear below and explain the error.

If you do not know the CRN

Basic Search – default view

- 1) Click "Search for a class" in Quick Links area or Class Search button at the bottom of the page
- 2) From the dropdown menu "Select A Term" choose the term to search, Click Submit
- 3) In "Look Up Classes" - Click to select the desired Subject from the alphabetical scrolling list
- 4) Click "Course Search"
- 5) Courses in that subject area are listed, with View Sections buttons to the right
- 6) Click the View Sections button for a course to view the availability

Advanced Search – used when looking for all courses related to a specific subject area required by a course, or a specific subject, time slot, etc.

- 1) Click "Search for a class" in Quick Links area or Class Search button at the bottom of the page
- 2) From the dropdown menu "Select A Term" choose the term to search, Click Submit
- 3) Without choosing a subject, scroll down to the bottom of the page and click "Advanced Search" to display numerous criteria to search.
- 4) The more criteria that are chosen, the narrower the list of results.

Viewing the Search Results. The search results are displayed with column headings.

- **Select:** Square indicates an available course/section, (C) indicates closed section
- **CRN:** Identifies the CRN (Course Reference Number) if you should need to note it
- **Subj:** Subject area

- **Crse:** Course number
- **Sec:** Section identifier
- **Days:** Days of the week are each first initial = (M, T, W, F), Thursday = (R), Saturday = (S)
- **Time:** Time the course meets
- **Cap:** Seat capacity
- **WL Cap** or **WL Rem:** Waitlist Capacity or Waitlist Remaining seats
- **Instructor:** Instructor's name, if assigned
- **Location:** Building and Room, if assigned

Selecting the Class

- 1) Click the Check Box of the desired class in the Select column,
- 2) Scroll to the bottom of the page and click the **Register** button in the lower left corner. You will be returned to the Add/Drop Classes page.
- 3) The status of the class is listed the Current Schedule area

Note: If there is a problem with the registration a section titled **Registration Add Errors** will appear below and explain the error.

Dropping a Class

- 1) If a course needs to be Dropped, Click Add/Drop classes from the Quick Links
- 2) Scroll down to Current Schedule
- 3) In the Action column select Drop/Web for course to be dropped
- 4) Scroll to the bottom of the page and click Submit Changes. You will be returned to the Add/Drop Classes page.

Waitlist

To Place a Class on Waitlist

- 1) Search for the class. Once displayed, determine by viewing the **WL Rem** (Waitlist Remaining) column where a number greater than "0" indicates a waitlist is available.
- 2) Write down the CRN number
- 3) Scroll to the bottom of the page. Click Register. You will be returned to the Add/Drop Classes page.
- 4) Scroll down to the Add Classes worksheet
- 5) Type in the CRN you wrote in to one of the 10 blank fields
- 6) Click Submit changes
- 7) A registration Add Errors section will appear
- 8) Select Waitlist under the Action column
- 9) Click Submit Changes

Remember to add labs when necessary. If a student does not have a computer with Internet capabilities, they can use one in the computer labs, the library, or the Dolan School of Business. If a student needs assistance with registration, they should contact the Registrar's Office at 254-4288 or (or just 4288 on campus). **They SHOULD NOT call the Help Desk.**

Remember, anyone with a Financial or Dean of Student's "HOLD" will not be allowed to register.

NEW COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BI 315 Anatomy: Form and Function

This course examines the anatomy of animals emphasizing the functional and evolutionary diversity of vertebrates. The course will consist of lectures focused on morphological variation and evolution, readings of the primary literature and required anatomical dissections of comparative structures. (Prerequisites: BI 170, BI 171, BI 172) Three credits.

EN 100 A Special Topics: Jewish Literature – Identity and Meaning in 20th Century American Jewish Literature

Storytelling is central to Jewish identity and search for meaning, from the Old Testament to graphic novels and comic books about Jewish life and culture after the Holocaust. Twentieth-century American Jewish writing strongly influenced TV, film, Broadway, social justice movements and more, reaching out to the widest range of American audiences. This course surveys American Jewish literature's use of Yiddish and Jewish ethnic and historical sources to produce lasting and relevant American prose, drama, poetry, and film. Prerequisite: EN 12 or equivalent and sophomore-level status.

EN 200 A Special Topics in American Literature: Edith Wharton and Her Circle

A chronological survey of science fiction, EN 200 begins with classic, pre-modern cautionary tales that position science against (human) nature. We next study the "Golden Age" of Sci/Fi in the United States, (1940's-70's) through texts that respond to both scientific innovations (nuclear war, the space race, robotics) and foreign and domestic politics. Finally, we turn to the eco-disaster narratives of Octavia Butler and Alan Moore to study our current ecological crisis. Students will be introduced to a number of topics, including dystopia/utopia, imagined future(s) and temporality, environmental holocaust, theories of human exceptionalism and race, post/de-colonization, concepts of forbidden knowledge, religion and science, and contemporary ecocriticism. Prerequisite: EN 100-level course or permission of instructor.

EN 200 B Special Topics: Intro to Science Fiction

A chronological survey of science fiction, EN 200 begins with classic, pre-modern cautionary tales that position science against (human) nature. We next study the "Golden Age" of Sci/Fi in the United States, (1940's-70's) through texts that respond to both scientific innovations (nuclear war, the space race, robotics) and foreign and domestic politics. Finally, we turn to the eco-disaster narratives of Octavia Butler and Alan Moore to study our current ecological crisis. Students will be introduced to a number of topics, including dystopia/utopia, imagined future(s) and temporality, environmental holocaust, theories of human exceptionalism and race, post/de-colonization, concepts of forbidden knowledge, religion and science, and contemporary ecocriticism. Prerequisite: EN 100-level course or permission of instructor.

EN 203 English Epic

Study of large-scale, verse narratives created as, or received as, English national epics, or composed in or in reaction to the epic tradition. Texts will represent the major earlier time periods of English literary history: Beowulf from the Old English period; Chaucer's Knight's Tale from the Middle English period; excerpts from Spenser's Faerie Queene from the Elizabethan period; Milton's Paradise Lost from the seventeenth century; Pope's Rape of the Lock from the eighteenth century. Critical attention will be paid throughout to changing and competing conceptions of England, nation, and epic. (Prerequisite: 100-level English literature class or the equivalent, or permission of instructor) Three credits.

ENW 306 CreativeNonfiction II

Students will build upon knowledge of creative nonfiction to practice the art of memoir in a workshop setting. Students will read in sub-genres such as Adversity/Transformation, Family/Generational, Political/Social, and Spiritual Memoirs and will gain skills necessary to see their own life story as material for multiple memoirs. Prerequisite: Creative Nonfiction or, if you have equivalent experience, permission of instructor. Three credits.

MA 18 Math and the City

This course is an introduction to topics from discrete mathematics. Topics will include graph theory, voting systems, and fair divisions. The course is an opportunity for students to get in contact with small local businesses, which will come to the classroom and presents some problems. Students will need to work on a project and apply the material they have learnt in the classroom towards a possible solution of the problem. Three credits.

MA 119 Applied Calculus I

Topics in this course include: foundations of the calculus; differentiation of algebraic, exponential and logarithmic functions; extrema and curve sketching; applications of derivatives; antiderivatives; the Fundamental Theorem of Calculus; and integration of algebraic functions. A graphing calculator and Wolfram Alpha are among the technologies that may be used. MA 119 is not a prerequisite for MA 171; students who received credit for MA 10, MA 145 or MA 171 may not take MA 119 for credit. (Prerequisite: Precalculus) Three credits.

NEW COURSE DESCRIPTIONS *(continued)*

MA 300 Topics in Discrete Mathematics

This course builds on the skills developed in MA 231. Topics include basic combinatorics (permutations, combinations, counting complicated sets, binomial coefficients), elementary number theory (divisors, Euclid's algorithm, modular arithmetic), and elementary graph theory (connectivity, circuits, cycles, planar graphs, graph isomorphisms). Sophomores will have priority registration for this course. (Prerequisite: MA 231 or equivalent or permission of the department chair) Three credits.

MLL 289 Second Language Teaching and Technology

A critical overview of technologies and applications for facilitating the teaching and learning of foreign and second languages. Teaching techniques, hands-on practice, and theoretical frameworks. Introduction to major methodologies, foreign language standards, and research trends in second language acquisition with best practices in technology-enhanced language learning (TELL) in secondary-school and post-secondary curricula. Experience with teaching or tutoring highly recommended. Taught in English with examples from several languages. Three credits.

PO 190 A Special Topics: World Government

The absence of a world government creates serious challenges for states to cooperate and coordinate with one another and find solutions to common problems such as terrorism, trafficking, and the environment. States have turned to international law and international institutions to compensate for the absence of a central authority. In this course we take up the issue of global governance by first examining the nature of international law. Is it really law? Where does its authority come from? How is it enforced? Second we will study the role and reach of the United Nations looking beyond the part played by the Security Council. No prerequisites.

RS 241 Encountering God in Medieval Christian Thought

This course presents a historical overview of religious thought in the medieval era (c. 500-1500), with a focus on the institutional and theological developments within Christian monasteries and universities. We will first treat the development of Benedictine monasticism and the types of theological literature associated with the monasteries, before looking at the development of the University system in Western Europe and the types of theology produced in the schools. Finally, we will treat the pervasive presence of "mystical theologians" who were often neither monks nor university professors, but developed a rich theology grounded in human experience. Three credits. (Pre-requisite: RS 101)
